

On the Upper Cambrian *Lingulella* Salter (Brachiopoda) from the Holy Cross Mountains, Poland

Abundant but not very well preserved uppermost Cambrian Obolidae King, genus *Lingulella* Salter dominating, was recovered from recent boring in the Holy Cross Mountains (Góry Świętokrzyskie). One of the aims of this study was to define and discuss some of the available diagnostic characters for species within lingulellids. *Obolus* sp. and two species of *Lingulella* Salter were recognized, *Lingulella lepis* Salter represented by numerous valves, and *L. cf. davisii* (M'Coy) occurring sporadically.
