

Pennular and non-pennular Jurassic scleractinians - some examples

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Four Malmian corals of different microstructures have been described: *Thamnasteria concinna*, *Dimorpha straea* sp., *Actinaraeopsis exilis* and *Isastraea* cf. *bernensis*. Aragonite coral tissue being preserved, histological observations have been initiated. Taxonomical value of microstructure and histology, as decisive for suprageneric division, is confirmed. In four discussed species, trabeculae are of a branched morphology and non-sclerodermite structure. Each species represents a different variety of trabecular histology. A restricted significance of synapticalae for taxonomical purposes is confirmed. Are described vertical adtrabecular bars, a new skeletal element in *Th. concinna*.
